Historic vehicles of all ages will be arriving in Sleaford on Saturday 5th September from across the region for the Sleaford Historic Car and Motorcycle Show. Look out for them as they travel through town towards St George's College ready for the 10.30 am opening.

Spectators are welcome from 10.30 am through to the show closing at 4.30 pm. There is no admission charge and pedestrians are welcome either through the main entrance on Westgate or along the path off Northgate, between the Pygott & Crone offices.

There's no public parking on site (except for a small number of spaces for disabled drivers), but it's not far from Westgate car park, Sainsbury's, Tesco or Money's Yard car parks. There's free parking at Eastgate car park and at the Council offices car park further along Eastgate.

The organisers are very grateful for the sponsorship they have received from Sleaford Town Council, Sleaford BID, Keith Bird Motorsport, Four Seasons Garden Centre, A & H Factors, Cawsey Motors, Ferg Philips, Malcs Bodyshop, SAMS, Moore and Scrupps, Scriminger Engine Developments, Westgate Electrical, John Peat Motors, Lincolnshire Co-operative, Chattertons and Roberts Tyres.

To accompany the static display of around 200 classic vehicles, organisers are also expecting the Newark Radio Controlled Racing Cars Club, Karts from Coningsby Kart Club and rally cars from Keith Bird Motorsport. Highlighting the green theme of this year's show, visitors will also be able to see some of the latest alternative-fuel transport including gas and electricity-powered vehicles.

A raffle raising money for the Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire Air Ambulance will feature prizes donated by Cogglesford Mill Cottage Restaurant and 'green motoring' cotton shopping bags specially produced by local company, Smudgeonline.

Refreshments will be on sale including lunches, hotdogs, snacks, cakes and ice-cream and there will be a bouncy castle for the children.

The Mayor of Sleaford, Councillor Gordon Blythe, and Chairman of North Kesteven District Council, Councillor Fred Ambridge, will be visiting during the day and the organisers are pleased to announce that this year's guest of honour will be 1960s TT sidecar champion, Chris Vincent.

Don't forget it's also the town's Farmers Market on the Market Place on the same day – pop down and pick up some of the excellent local produce on sale.
