Organisers of the Sleaford Historic Car and Motorcycle Show next month are delighted to announce that, despite earlier concerns, they have been able to confirm a full set of sponsors to cover all the classes including the new one introduced in 2007 for the 'Well Loved, Well Used' Trophy to be presented to the best vehicle in everyday use.

Sleaford BID has stepped in to top up the Town Council's funding to cover the venue costs and other companies supporting the 2009 show are Keith Bird Motorsport, Four Seasons Garden Centre, A & H Factors, Cawsey Motors, Ferg Philips, Malcs Bodyshop, SAMS, Moore and Scrupps, Scriminger Engine Developments, Westgate Electrical, John Peat Motors, Lincolnshire Co-operative, Chattertons and Roberts Tyres.

Trophies are presented for the age-related classes and for Best Bike in Show, Best Car in Show and the Best Club Stand.

The show opens to the public at 10.30 am on Saturday 5th September. Admission is free.

To accompany the static display of around 200 classic vehicles, the day will also feature an exciting 'thrills and spills' display of radio controlled racing cars in action, Karts from Coningsby Kart Club and a spectacular static display of rally cars from Keith Bird Motorsport.

The theme of this year's show is greener motoring. The organisers believe that keeping well-maintained classic vehicles on the road is environmentally better than buying new cars and this year, as always, is a celebration of the best of the classic vehicles. However there will also be displays showing some of the alternative fuel sources, including electric and gas-powered vehicles. Students from Cotelands School Greenpower team are going to be there to talk about their project.

Throughout the day refreshments will be on sale – from a complete lunch to snacks and ice-cream - and there will be a bouncy castle for the children.

On the same day it's the town's Farmers Market taking place only a short walk away, making the 5th September a great day out in Sleaford.
